In Class One we have had a brilliant first half term adjusting to being back at school and helping lots of new children to settle in- which they have done fantastically and already show so many of our Christian Values!

We have been so busy learning this half term, including some road safety training, meeting our spelling 'aliens', planting daffodils in the community garden, learning about the 12 disciples, drawing self-portraits for our display, making up our own spooky Halloween dances and we even found a newt whilst looking through some Autumn leaves! It has been very interesting, exciting and great fun!







Class 2 have enjoyed learning about the Romans. They have made a timeline to show the Roman Invasions and enjoyed finding out interesting facts about Hadrian's Wall and Boudicca. In Geography we have learnt about the water cycle and the children worked in groups to make a working model of the water cycle. The children have also been finding out about solids, liquids and gases and have been developing their science skills investigating which fizzy drink contains the most carbon dioxide.
