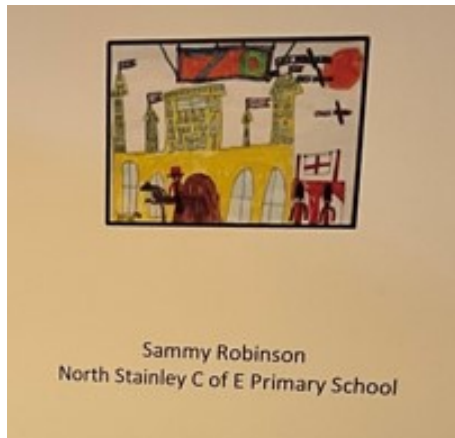
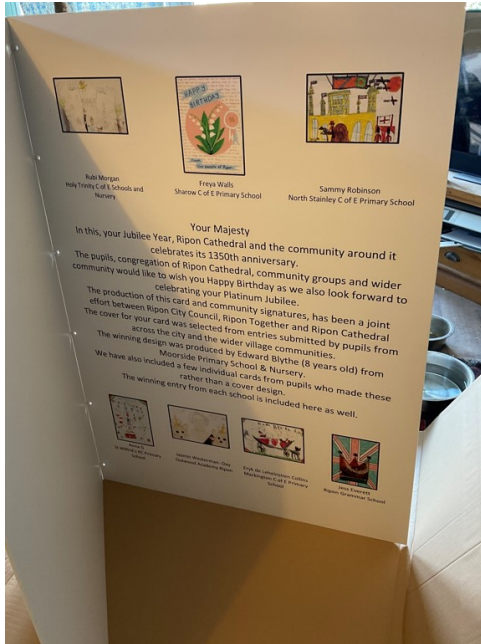

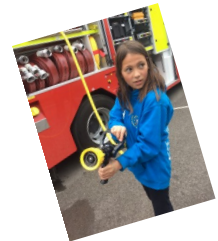


### Jubilee Gardens.

Thank you to Kia and Andrew Mathieson who have been a link for the school to this beautiful garden and wonderful community resource. Kia kindly invited the school to join her in the Autumn term to plant spring bulbs, we watched them flower in the spring and over the past few months a team led by Kia and Andrew have been planning and planting in order that this garden is looking it's best for the Jubilee Celebrations and on into the future. Class One went out to enjoy the garden last week.



**Fire Safety**, is huge part of ensuring that children have an awareness of danger and are equipped with some knowledge of how best to avoid danger or how to deal with it. This month, local fire officers came into the school to talk to the children about fire safety and about being safe in their own homes. They also brought along the Fire Engine which proved as popular as ever!!



**Mini Medics.** Continuing our learning around safeguarding and providing the children with the lifelong 'tools' that will enable them to look after themselves. The mini medics trainer arrived in school this half term. Our trainer worked with both Key stages bringing first aid to life for them all and providing them with a set of skills that could prove invaluable.

Key Stage One learnt about how best to deal with bumps, cuts and bruising. Why and how we call the emergency services, they even learnt something about the recovery position.

Key Stage 2 learnt all of the above but went on to work with dummies to practise CPR and what to do if someone is choking/. These sessions were delivered in a very practical way, enabling all children to access them.





Our Great Yorkshire Show, veg box entry was judged last week and we now await finding out if we are amongst the 12 finalists to go to the Show for final judging.

Mrs McArthur and Mrs Platts have supported the children since Christmas with their re-searching, building, planting, decorating and cultivating the box that is based on the theme 'Best of British'. This also aims to support lowering carbon footprints and buying locally. Well done everyone and fingers crossed for the final!!



### Jubilee Learning

The children have gained a lot of knowledge about our Monarchy, Great Britain and the Commonwealth through the medium of the Platinum Jubilee. This knowledge supports History, Geography, British Values and Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural learning in the school.

Class One presented an entertaining piece each, about what they would do if they were to be Queen/King for a day. This included wearing a sparkly gown, having servants brush their teeth and walking their dogs!

Class two were able to recount a number of facts they had learnt about the Queen throughout her life.

Class Three wrote and read newspaper reports as though they themselves were at the coronation in 1953.



**Jubilee Art Competition.** The North Stainley Sports and Recreation Trust represented by Glenys Bailey approached the school about taking part in an art competition. The theme was to design and paint a crown and the winners would each have their work printed, framed and hung at the front of school for the Jubilee Celebrations. Organised by Miss Gregory, the children worked very hard, coming up with the most creative and beautiful of designs. Deciding on the best 14 pictures was almost impossible and as a result, all of the pictures are being displayed in the village hall over the Jubilee weekend as well as the winners being hung at the front of the school.
