




CLASS 2 AT BEWERLEY PARK


As promised, this week's Year 3 and 4's overnight residential at Bewerley Park.




On Monday 12th of June

Road Safety

After a terrible accident at one of our local cluster schools this week, I would like to draw your attention once again to ensuring the safety of our children in relation to the A6108 (the road running outside of the school). As has also been pointed out by members of our local community, it is imperative we park responsibly in order that there is full visibility in all directions.

Therefore please can I remind everyone from the highway code rule 243

DO NOT stop or park:

opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space

We thank you for your consideration and adherence to the rules where road safety is concerned.
