

## <u>Class One- EYFS provision, small world area</u>

In EYFS, the children's topic for this half term has been 'amazing animals'. The one area the children have continually shown development and progress by working as a team, is in the small world area. Here the children were asked to 'build a zoo'. Each week their zoo's have grown in everyway- size, varying levels, arrangements of enclosures, use of other props... it even went from a walk around zoo to a drive around safari! The children's attention to detail and the way they have made links with their learning has 'blown us all away!'







#### <u>Art Club</u>

In art club this half term we have focused on a range of different techniques and skills through discovering different artists.
