

Class 1 News

<u>Maths:</u> In Maths, Reception and Nursery have been consolidating their numbers to 5 and counting to five using the cardinal rule. We applied this learning whilst counting out different ingredients to mix and make flapjack for the class. Great fun was had, as well as cross curricular learning such as hygiene, balanced diets, favourite foods and how the oven heats up the ingredients to help make the flapjack edible. The taste test went down well too!!

<u>Fine Motor Development:</u> We have re-introduced daily Dough Disco with the children in reception and Nursery and they love "Going to the Dough Disco", patting, squashing, poking and slapping the dough to build up their fine motor skills and muscles!

<u>Computing:</u> In KS1 we have been focusing on digital writing. We used the brand new Chromebooks for the first time the other day, with some children from KS2 coming in to assist us. We are learning what a word processor is and we have been asking the question: Is typing or handwriting preferable? We will be moving onto editing and changing the text next.
