The best of the entries will be collected in a book published during the festival. Everyone who has a poem in the book will receive a free copy of the book and be invited to read at the launch on Saturday 24 September.

### There are four entry-categories:

under 11 (£2 entry fee per poem)
schools (£15 entry fee for up to 20 poems)
between 11-16 (£3 entry fee per poem)
adults (£4 entry fee per poem or £5 for 2 poems)

You can submit as many poems as you want.

Maximum length for each poem is 45 lines.

Poems must be your own work and should not have been previously published. All entries are judged anonymously so please do not include your name on the same page as the poem.
